
It is incumbent upon the children to exert themselves to the utmost in acquiring the art of reading and writing ...

Let there be naught in your demeanor of which sound and upright minds would disapprove, and make not yourselves the playthings of the ignorant.

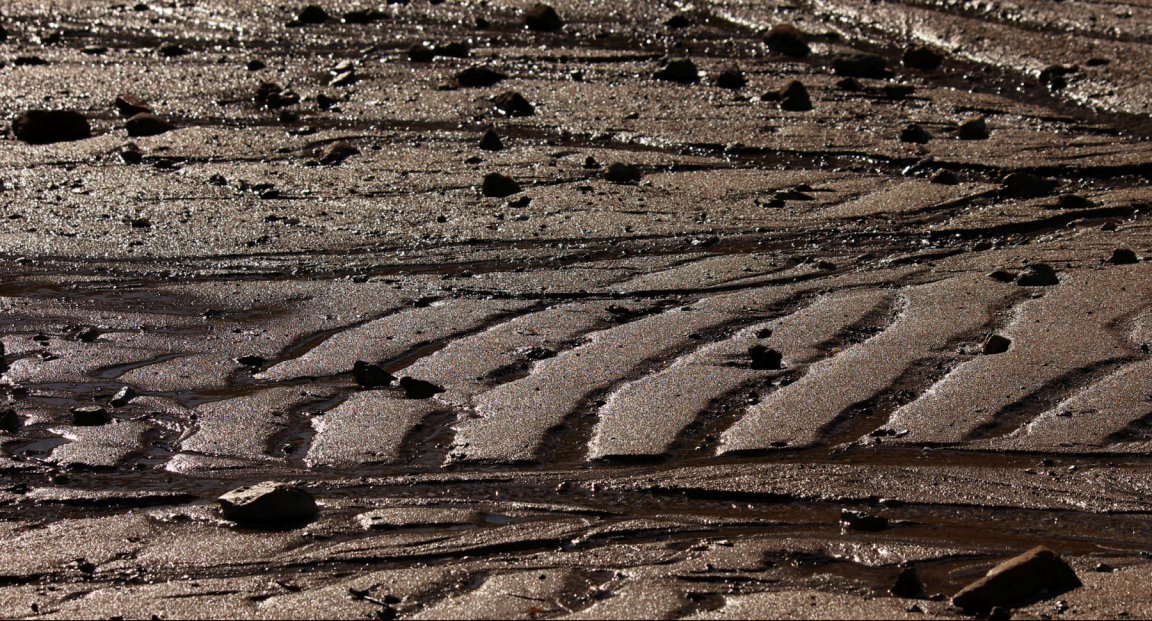
